


# ODP Background

- **30 April 1998** - ODP established to improve state and local WMD incident response capabilities nationwide
  - **Equipment grants**
  - **Coordinated training programs**
  - **Exercise support**
  - **Technical assistance**
- **1 March 2003** - Transitioned to Department of Homeland Security

# TRANSITION

Eleven (11) programs are being transferred from their current agencies to the Office of State and Local Government Coordination and Preparedness.

## **7 programs are being transferred from EP&R, including:**

- Metropolitan Medical Response System (MMRS)
- Emergency Management Performance Grants (EMPG)
- Community Emergency Response Teams (CERT)
- First Responder Counter-Terrorism Training Assistance
- State and Local All Hazards Emergency Operations Planning
- Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program (“Fire Act”)(Already in ODP)
- Citizen Corps (Already in ODP)

## **4 programs are being transferred from TSA, including:**

- Port Security Grant Program
- Intercity Bus Security Grants
- Operation Safe Commerce
- Trucking Industry Security Grant Program

# ODP Mission

**“The primary responsibility within the executive branch of Government to build and sustain the preparedness of the United States to reduce vulnerabilities, prevent, respond to and recover from acts of terrorism,”**

# State Administrative Agencies (SAA)

- Each state / territory has an appointed contact that is responsible for managing all ODP grants
- The SAA should be the main point of contact as they are the eventual recipient of all grant awards
- Private organizations should work through the SAA to obtain detailed information about potential purchases by governmental organizations
- Local representatives have been designated by each SAA to administer local programs

# ODP Program Approach

- **State Homeland Security Assessment & Strategy Program**
  - ◆ **Identify state & local capabilities and needs through threat/vulnerability/needs assessments**
  - ◆ **Develop baseline for capabilities and needs**
  - ◆ **Develop multi-year preparedness plans**
- **Homeland Security Strategy**
  - ◆ **Based on risk and threat assessment data**
  - ◆ **Includes specific goals and objectives addressing:**
    - **Prevention**
    - **Response**
    - **Recovery**
  - ◆ **Assists states & federal government with targeting resources & refining existing programs**
  - ◆ **Must be submitted to receive grant funding in FY 04**

# ODP Program Approach

- **State Assistance Plan (SAP)/Metropolitan Assistance Plans (MAP)**
  - ◆ **Created from State and Urban Area Strategies and assessment data by ODP**
  - ◆ **Blueprint and work plan for the delivery of ODP training, exercise, technical assistance, equipment services, and other federal resources**
  - ◆ **Tailored and formulated for each state and urban area**

# ODP PROGRAMS

# ODP Training Program

**Comprehensive combating terrorism training at the awareness, performance (technician & operations), and management and planning levels.**

- Conducted in residence, on-site, or through distance education.
- Provide over 40 training courses approved by state & local providers
- Oversee training programs developed & delivered by the National Domestic Preparedness Consortium and national associations.
- Provide training grants in '03 to institutionalize awareness-level training at the state and local levels.
- Develop a Performance-Based Training, Exercise and Evaluation Management System.

**Since 1998 ODP has trained over 400,000 emergency responders.**

# ODP Equipment Programs

**Provide formula grants for equipment acquisition, consistent with State Strategies, to state and local agencies to respond to threats or acts of terrorism.**

- Expanded the Approved Equipment List, including prevention equipment and response vehicles.
- Pre-Positioned Equipment Program (PEP)
- Homeland Defense Equipment Reuse (HDER) Program.
- Domestic Preparedness Equipment Technical Assistance Program (DPETAP)

**ODP has made over \$6.6 BILLION in Homeland Security funding**

# ODP Exercise Program

Provide expert assistance in design, development, conduct and evaluation of combating terrorism exercises, and delivers:

- Exercise grant funding and direct support to States to establish exercise programs and conduct exercises.
- A National Exercise Program, including:
  - National / International Top Officials (TOPOFF) Exercise Series.
  - Regional Exercise Program.
  - National Security Special Event Exercise Program.
- Homeland Security Exercise & Evaluation Program (HSEEP)
  - Volume I: Program Overview & Doctrine
  - Volume II: Exercise Evaluation & Improvement
  - Volume III: Exercise Development Manual
  - Volume IV: Sample Exercise Documents & Formats

**ODP has supported conduct of over 350 combating terrorism exercises to date, including the Top Officials (TOPOFF) exercise series.**

# ODP Technical Assistance Program

**Provides tailored expert assistance to the Homeland Security community in combating terrorism preparedness, including:**

- Support for Statewide Homeland Security Strategy development and conduct of assessments.
- Centralized Scheduling and Information Desk (CSID) / Helpline, and homeland security information resources.
- Support to key public sector associations.
- Support to meet specific requests outside of training, exercise, and equipment support.

# State Homeland Security Grant Program SHSGP II

- **Funding available and awarded: \$1.5B**
- **56 states and territories**
- **Authorized program expenditures:**
  - ❖ **Critical Infrastructure Protection**
  - ❖ **First Responder Preparedness (Equipment, Exercises, Training, and Planning & Administrative)**

# URBAN AREAS SECURITY INITIATIVE

## UASI I

- Grant funding available: **\$96.351M**
- 7 urban areas selected by DHS
- Authorized program expenditures:
  - ❖ **Planning, Equipment, Training, Exercises, and Management & Administration**

# URBAN AREAS SECURITY INITIATIVE

## UASI II

- **Grant funding available: \$500M**
- **19 States & National Capital Region**
  - ❖ **30 Urban Areas, including 7 from UASI I**
- **Authorized program expenditures:**
  - ❖ **Planning, Equipment, Training, Exercises, Management & Administration, and Operational Activities**

# URBAN AREAS SECURITY INITIATIVE

## Port Security

- Grant funding available: **\$75M**
- 14 port zones, 50 grantees, 84 individual projects
  - ❖ Coordinated with TSA which received, reviewed and ranked project proposals
- Authorized program expenditures:
  - ❖ **Enhanced Facility and Operational Security**
  - ❖ **Critical Information Sharing**
  - ❖ **Operational Activities**

# URBAN AREAS SECURITY INITIATIVE

## Transit System Security

- Grant funding available: **\$65M**
- 20 selected high threat mass transit systems
- Authorized program expenditures:
  - ❖ **Planning, Equipment, Training, Exercises, and Operational Activities**

# ODP FISCAL YEAR 2004 GRANT

## ❖ **Homeland Security Grant Program ( 3 grants totaling \$2.2B):**

- State Homeland Security Program (SHSP) (\$1.675B)– provide funds to enhance the capability of State and local units of governments to prevent, deter, respond to, and recover from incidents of terrorism
- Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention Program (LETPP) (\$497M)– provide law enforcement communities with enhanced capabilities for detecting, deterring, disrupting and preventing acts of terrorism
- Citizen Corps Program (CCP) (\$34.7M)– support Citizen Corps Councils with planning, outreach and management of Citizen Corps programs and activities

## ❖ **Urban Area Security Initiative Program ( 2 grants totaling \$720M):**

- Urban Areas Grant (\$671M) – address the unique equipment, training, planning and exercise needs of large high threat urban areas
- Mass Transit Grant (\$49.7M) – address security needs at high risk critical infrastructure facilities and promote comprehensive regional planning and coordination
